An Examination of Luther Seminary Course Syllabi (Draft 1)

A Project of the Committee Addressing Racism (CAR)

This survey of Luther Seminary Syllabi attempts to discover what percentage of texts utilized as *required* reading in Luther Seminary current M.Div. and M.A. classes is written by non-dominant-culture authors versus dominant-culture authors (generally white, male, European-origin in ethnicity or culture). This survey looked only at required reading (core learning) texts, and made preliminary judgments of the culture of the author by looking at the authors of the texts themselves, consulting the faculty who teach that particular course, and content/emphasis.

Recommended reading lists, hand-outs, media and other sources were not examined. This report gleaned data from a sample of syllabi from the Fall, 2002 semester.
